EuroDIG 2015 – Programme structure

For the EuroDIG 2015 planning meeting on 31 January in Sofia we compiled all submissions and did a rough clustering in key topics. Based on the results of the planning meeting and the online voting, we drafted a first programme structure, which was open for comments and review by the community until 15 March 2015.

Herewith we present the final version of the programme structure, which still needs more specifications and tuned focus. Session titles are working titles – except for the opening session “How can we shape the digital single market together?”. According to the list of proposals we related all respective numbers to the proposed sessions in the programme outline.

The challenge at hand is now to form session org teams that collaborate on preparing their respective session and identify focal points for each session. Focal points are the main contact person and shall take over responsibility for a reliable and inclusive session planning according to the EuroDIG session principles (see: <http://www.eurodig.org/get-involved/organising-a-session/>). Focal points are supposed to get in touch with other submitters (see related proposal numbers) by encouraging them to contribute to the session planning.

For the collaboration of org teams and the documentation on the session planning we provide a wiki page for each session (www.eurodigwiki.org) The wiki is publicly available and aims to keep all information and workflows in one place. It will make it easier for other interested people to participate and will increase inclusiveness and transparency of the EuroDIG process - according to EuroDIGs slogan:

“... always open, always inclusive and never too late to get involved!”

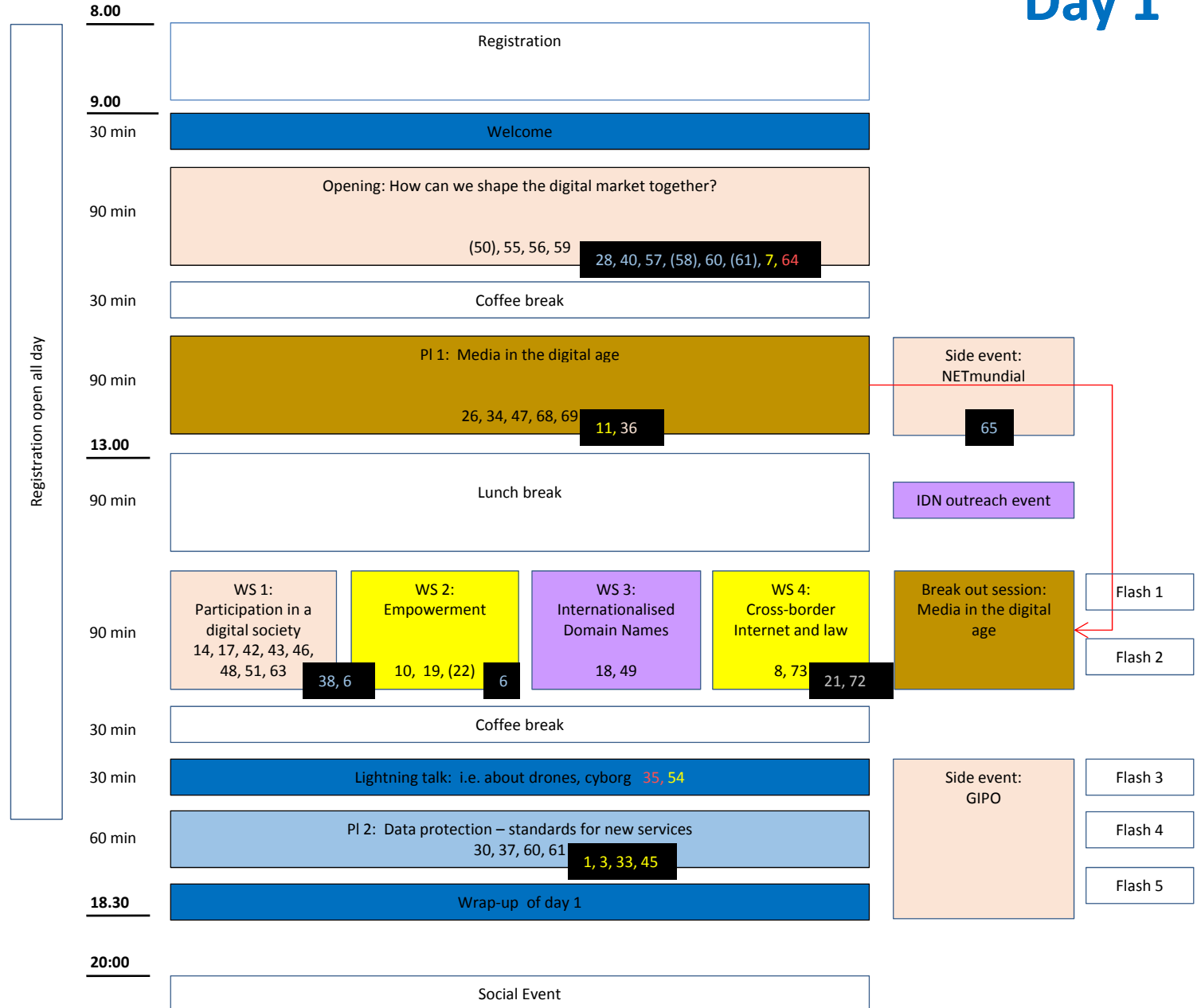
