Introduction

Youth IGF Argentina is an initiative that seeks to amplify the voices of young people from 18 to 30 years old, who are interested in Internet Governance issues. The event was focused on general themes on Internet Governance from a youth perspective.

The 2018 annual meeting followed the presentation of the Youth IGF Argentina in 2017 during the IGF Argentina meeting. In 2018, the Youth IGF Argentina was a one-day event and was held on July, 29th, 2018, from 11 am to 7 pm at San Martín 536, First Floor, in the City of Buenos Aires. The 2019 meeting was held at NIC Argentina's offices (the Network Information Center Argentina), which is the governmental office responsible for operating the ".ar" Country Code Top-Level Domain. NIC Argentina staff helped with logistics, such as the provision of the venue, the sound and visual equipment, registration equipment, and they helped with the design of the web page.

• Preparatory Meetings and Process

The Youth IGF Argentina Founding Team held several conference calls (since one of the members lives in Santa Fe City; and other two members were attending the IGF2019 at the same time of the last preparatory online meetings), as well in person-meetings to establish goals and activities required to organise the meeting. The Team also reached to well-known Internet Governance actors that work in Argentina in order to ensure diversity on topics, representation of different sectors and a multistakeholder approach.

During the internal meetings, we decided to partner with NIC.AR since it has been very supportive of previous editions of Youth IGF Argentina and helped to successfully conduct the event on the settled date and time.

• How the Preparatory Process Was Conducted in Accordance with the Main IGF Principles

The Youth IGF Argentina was set according to the principles of multistakeholderism, having as composition all the multi stakeholders (with the exception of the government representative) in the organization process of our annual meeting. This Program Committee was responsible for setting the format, taking into account the most suitable ways to engage young individuals from Argentina with relevant topics discussed last year in our country, as well as preparing the logistics needed to host the meeting. The Youth IGF Argentina Program Committee held several online meetings through the platform Zoom to define the program, in active contact with NIC.AR, the partner which helped us to host the meeting at a venue with disabled access and facilities in the city of Buenos Aires. The goal was to keep a collaborative

environment, including all the youth voices, and with a strong perspective on inclusion matters.

• Format and Structure

We chose two formats for the meeting. "Birds of a Feather" was chosen in order to maximize the participation of attendees as well as fostering young individuals to make questions on the topics. In the case of the interactive activity "Tensiones en la Red" ('Tensions in the Net'), we made a big Break Up Group. Participants analyzed a set of images and posts on social media platforms with potentially illicit content in order to trigger a discussion on intermediary liability on the Internet, and a potential regulation of content by social media platforms.

The event was open to the public, with a previous registration on Eventbrite in order to guarantee enough spots for the attendees; and was widely disseminated on social media.

At this edition, we recorded the event through Facebook Live platform, and shared on Twitter and Facebook relevant moments highlighted at the Youth IGF Argentina 2019.

• Development of the Event

Young attendees were very enthusiastic about taking part in the event, as most of them had participated in the previous Youth IGF Argentina that we carried out jointly with the Youth LACIGF 2018, hosted by the Youth Observatory, the organiser of this initiative since 2016.

The event was divided in two parts, having before the break the interactive activity 'Tensions in the Net'. Although most of the attendees had previous experience in Internet Governance meetings, they were not familiar with all the topics discussed, so we arranged our presentations according to their level of knowledge on the different subjects.

Most of the attendees came from the city and the province of Buenos Aires, since we could not provide fellowship grants for travel and accommodation.




