She explained the proliferation of Internet access in the future and its
potential risks, and then introduced worldwide activities to combat
against child sexual abuse materials (CSAMs) by Internet Association of
Internet Hotlines (INHOPE).

He made a presentation on the up-to-date situation of Internet safety in
Democratic and Republic of Congo (DRC). He emphasized the
importance
of Internet education especially for family, church, school and
community/society, and insisted that each of the above stakeholders has
to
play a respective role in protecting children online.

Mr. Yang briefly explained that it depends on each generation what kind
of application is used and therefore we all have to bear it in mind in
thinking about how to protect younger generations online. Ms. Wong,
while showing a short movie on online shopping and overcharging with
misused information, emphasized the necessity of Internet education. In
addition, activities of Youth Internet Governance Forum (YIGF) was also
introduced.
