Giacomo Mazzone – Personal Response to IGF MAG Chair Call for Information on Concrete Actions and Decisions

Dear Janis,

Following your kind invitation to provide some elements of evaluation of what IGF (in its second mandate) has produced as impact in the community at large, I'm happy to share some thoughts, for what concern the media / broadcasting ecosystem.

Apart of the EuroDIG (that was created within the first mandate of the IGF as a direct consequence of this event, with the EBU contribution) but that has continued to grow and become more relevant all along these last years, I can mention:

- The creation in 2011 of the internal coordination within EBU broadcasters on the Net Neutrality, as a consequence of the debates within IGF. Such a coordination became now a permanent group of activity within EBU and could now become a WBU (worldwide) coordination group;
- The creation of a world radio committee within the WBU, with the specific purpose to support the transition of radios into the Internet world and to defend their interests within the Internet Governance various fora;
- The decision to apply as a community to ICANN gTLD process for the top level domain .radio.
- The elaboration of a set of Public Service guidelines over the Internet to be applied by EBU members in transition to the on-line world.
- (in cooperation with ITU and UNICEF) the elaboration of the guidelines for the child on line protection for the industry (on line and off-line). A second edition will be released at IGF 2014 in Istanbul.
- (in cooperation with ITU and COP initiative) a group for cooperation on technical standards for Child On line Protection has been created to find standard solutions to protect children over the Internet.
