The limits to freedom of expression online

Guaranteeing the freedom of speech online while curbing hate speech, disinformation and cybercrime is one of the toughest balancing acts facing the global Internet governance community. Hear the perspectives of a seasoned politician, former foreign minister of Estonia and Member of the European Parliament Marina Kaljurand, and digital campaigner Jillian C. York, Director for International Freedom of Expression at the Electronic Frontier Foundation, author of "Silicon Values".
