

# INTERNET GOVERNANCE FORUM POLICY NETWORK ON ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE Meeting IV | 18 July 2023 at 13:00-14:30 UTC SUMMARY REPORT

#### **Action items:**

- PNAI report drafting teams will move on from planning phase and start drafting their report chapters.

- The fifth PNAI meeting will take place on Tuesday 15.8. at 13:00-14:30 UTC.
- 1. The fourth virtual meeting of the Policy Network on Artificial Intelligence (PNAI) took place on 18 July 2023 at 13:00-14:30 UTC.
- 2. The meeting was hosted by the IGF Secretariat's PNAI Consultant and the two MAG facilitators of the PNAI. The meeting Agenda is attached to this document as Annex A1. A list of meeting participants is annexed as A2 and the list of shared documents as A3.
- 3. The facilitators opened the meeting by sharing learnings from the IGF 2023 Second Open Consultations and MAG Meeting that took place the previous week. PNAI will plan a session for the 18th annual meeting of the IGF in October 2023. It is important to closely follow the preparations, connect organizers of AI-related workshop to PNAI's work, and, contribute to the ideation of the main session. IGF Leadership Panel Chair Vint Cerf encouraged the group to reflect on how to make the PNAI session as impactful as possible. IGF can bring value by producing actionable outputs on AI and the Global Digital Compact.
- 4. Representing the IGF 2023 Host Country Japan, Nobuhisa Nishigata welcomed the PNAI to Kyoto in October. He has joined the PNAI to create a link to the Host Country and gave a presentation on Japan promoting the international discussion on AI. Currently Japan holds the G7 Presidency. G7 Ministerial Declaration on global AI governance was adopted in April, including an action plan for promoting global interoperability between trustworthy AI tools. Following the presentation, attendees asked questions on defining interoperability and whether a global oversight body for AI would be needed.
- 5. Leaders of the three PNAI report drafting teams shared the status and their progress since the last PNAI meeting. 'AI and Gender/Race' team is working to define their main concepts. 'AI



and environment' team will build on existing use cases for the environment and governance of environmental data. 'Global interoperability of AI governance' team has had two meetings and is focusing on regulations. All teams were encouraged to start drafting their chapters. It is still possible to join the three groups by signing up to mailing lists through the PNAI website Materials page.

6. Celine Caira from the OECD gave a presentation on promoting interoperability in AI governance. OECD's recent high-level mapping of AI risk-management frameworks found most differences between the frameworks related to their governing function. A lively discussion followed the presentation: topics included creating tools to help in governing AI and the connection to underlying AI principles. Some highlighted that the focus in regulating technologies should be kept in the harmful behaviour instead of restricting specific technologies.

- 7. Drafting teams will move to the next phase and start to write their report chapters. Everyone is welcome to review the text and leave suggestions. The draft report chapters can be found by following the chapter links in the PNAI report outline stored in Google docs.

- 9. Attendees were asked to share their ideas and views on the PNAI session to be prepared for the 18th annual meeting of the IGF in October 2023.

- 11. The next PNAI meeting will take place on Tuesday 15.8. at 13:00-14:30 UTC. Registration will open soon through the PNAI website.
