SUMMARY REPORT

Action items:

1. The first virtual meeting in 2025 of the Policy Network on Artificial Intelligence (PNAI) Multistakeholder Working Group (MWG) took place online on Monday 7 April 2025 at 14:30 UTC.
2. The main goals of the meeting were to discuss the next steps of the PNAI, especially drafting a report that summarizes the ideas and provides a concrete plan on how the IGF can integrate Global Digital Compact implementation in its work going forward from 2026.
3. Meeting attendees were encouraged to share their views and comments. Inputs shared by members in the call included following:
 - Create a living document to integrating how NRI, DC, MAG and IGF ecosystem can contribute to the implementation of GDC. Identify and compile the relevant documents from Industry, Academia, Civil Society, IGO
 - Refer to the report from the AI High level Panel
 - Enhance cooperation & Collaboration with NRIs and the youth track. Incorporate the discussion in WSIS+20 and IGF can play
 - Foster closer relationship with the AI Scientific Panel & Dialogue and explore the opportunity to have an IGF Community member as liaison in Scientific Panel & Dialogue
 - Create concrete messages which people can use as talking points in global forums



- Be a liaison officer for PNAI at different platforms
- Position the PNAI messages to all relevant fora G7, G20, AI Summit in India in September
- Categorisation on what we need to address (ensure we talk about the same topics) and how we need to address and then identify and promote AI to serve all (humanity) not for a few (and develop a dynamic perspective how this could progress over time ...). The following categories may represent good sub-sections (from a global multipolar perspective one will be more important somewhere than somewhere else):
 - 1 - Safety and security;
 - 2 - Transparency and explainability;
 - 3 - Privacy and data governance;
 - 4 - Non-discrimination and fairness;
 - 5 - Accountability and governance;
 - 6 - National security and strategic autonomy;
 - 7 - Ethical use and human dignity;
- Plan an online discussion in May and invite the DC, NRIs, youth to the discussion
- Invite a representative from the ODET secretariat to the discussion to explore collaboration
