IGF 2022

Dynamic Coalition Coordination Group Virtual meeting #67 | 26 October 2022 Summary Report

Overview

Discussion revolved around more intricate aspects of the Dynamic Coalition Coordination Group's (DCCG) planning of the DC main session at the IGF 2022 meeting. More specifically, the focus was on populating the session's two panels. Mark Carvell, who is leading the main session organisation process, provided an updated draft agenda to guide the conversation (the document is attached as Annex I).

The meeting was moderated by Markus Kummer, Co-Facilitator of the DCCG.

Captioning for the meeting was not possible.

Key Points Raised

- 1. The group was reminded of the 1 November deadline for submitting main session agendas put in place by the IGF Secretariat.
- 2. The group was invited to comment on the most recent title suggestion (*Our Digital Future: How Dynamic Coalitions Support the Global Digital Compact*). This new variation was approved as the session's final title.
- 3. It was announced that the Youth Coalition on Internet Governance (YCIG) would be happy to provide one representative for each of the main session panels.
- 4. Two weeks prior, the DCCG had called for nominations for DC representation on the main session panels. During the meeting, it was announced that for Panel 1 the DCCG had chosen the Internet Standards, Security, and Safety Coalition (IS3C) and DC-Children. For Panel 2, the DCCG had settled on the DC on Gender and Internet Governance (DCGIG), the DC on Data Driven Health Technologies (DC-DDHT), the DC on Internet Rights and Principles (IRPC), and DC-Jobs. DC-DDHT had self-nominated for both panels. However, it was explained that, for reasons of diversity, the DCCG had decided to include DC-DDHT on Panel 2 but not Panel 1.

The DC on Schools of Internet Governance (DC-SIG) representative expressed that they had misunderstood parts of the nomination process. After the representative made the case for the DC-SIG to be included, the DCCG agreed to accord it a place on Panel 2.

- 5. It was decided that each chosen DC should propose two speakers to allow the DCCG to then pick representatives bearing in mind the various balances, such as geographic, gender, stakeholder group, online-offline.
- All DCs were reminded to each provide a short background document outlining their aims, visions and accomplishments.
- 7. The chosen DCs were reminded that panelists should not use simply present their DC's achievements over the past year but to stay focused on the two main session discussion questions.
- 8. The meeting attendees agreed on the importance of not forgetting the interactive parts of the main session.
- 9. The group agreed that Markus be the main session's moderator, potentially also with Tatiana Tropina, and Mark the rapporteur.

Next Steps

- 1. A new email is to be sent to the DC mailing list providing the updated main session agenda.
- 2. A message is to be sent to all DCs reminding them to submit a short explanatory document about their work by Friday 28 October.
- 3. Each DC providing a panelist is to suggest at least two speakers.
- 4. Invites to be on the main session panels are to be sent to the Technology Envoy, Leadership Panel, and Multistakeholder Advisory Group.
- 5. The core organizing group will meet online on Monday 31 October to verify that the main session agenda is ready to submit to the IGF Secretariat on Tuesday 1 November.

Description:

The UN Secretary-General's <u>Roadmap on Digital Cooperation</u> set out the so-called "IGF+" proposals for strengthening the Internet Governance Forum as a platform for multistakeholder dialogue with in particular greater diversity of participation, multi-year strategic planning, and the aim of delivering more tangible outcomes such as policy recommendations and best practice. In this way the IGF community of stakeholders will advance equitable and secure digital transformation in support of sustainable development and greater social well-being worldwide.

This interactive main session at IGF 2022 will have two panels. The first panel will discuss how specific intersessional activities of IGF dynamic coalitions can contribute to the evolution of the "IGF+" eco-system. The second panel will consider how individual dynamic coalitions can contribute to the development of the Global Digital Compact (GDC) to be agreed at the UN Summit of the Future in September 2024; and to the consultations undertaken during the UN General Assembly's "WSIS+20" Review in 2025.
