Dynamic Coalition Coordination Group (DCCG)

Virtual Meeting #83 | 3 April 2024

Summary Report

I. Adoption of the agenda

The agenda of the DCCG meeting #83 was adopted as proposed and is available in Annex I. The call was moderated by the DCCG co-facilitator Markus Kummer. The list of participants is attached as Annex II.

II. Updates from the Secretariat

Key points raised:

- Participants were informed about the outcomes of the First Open Consultations and MAG meeting that took place from 27 to 29 February in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, and were invited to review the [meeting notes](#). The MAG working group on multilingualism provided copies translated into [Arabic](#) and [Chinese](#).
- Participants were informed that the [Second Open Consultations and MAG Meeting](#) is taking place from 26 to 28 June 2024 in Geneva, Switzerland, with the Open Consultations day scheduled on 26 June. The [registration platform](#) is already open.
- The Leadership Panel (LP) members together with the IGF Secretariat have consolidated all comments received on the [Internet We Want](#) paper. The LP will meet in the upcoming days to discuss next steps.
- The IGF Secretariat reminded DC members about the open call for [session proposals](#) (deadline 30 April), for [village booth proposals](#) (deadline 30 June), and for [remote hubs](#) (deadline 30 July). All session organizers will be informed about their session acceptance or rejection shortly after the Second OC and MAG meeting.
- As for the intersessional work (Policy Networks and Best Practice Forums), the IGF has advertised the consultancies and plan on onboarding consultants as of 22 April.

III. Dynamic Coalition Specifier

Key points raised:

- The DC branding and specifier will define the role of DCs within the IGF ecosystem, providing some guidance to DCs when describing their relationship to the IGF process.

Next steps

- **The IGF Secretariat will share the DC specifier once approved internally.**

IV. IGF 2024 Call for Proposals – DCs approach

Key points raised:

- DC members were informed about the [call for session proposals](#), which is open until 30 April 2024.
- The MAG decided at its in-person meeting in Riyadh to remove town hall sessions as an attempt to simplify the programme. Also, the MAG will limit the number of slots for sessions

that are different from workshops (the final number of slots will be agreed upon by the MAG once all session proposals have been received).

- DCs were encouraged to submit joint session proposals, as slots for DC sessions will be limited by the MAG due to the growing number of DCs and limited space in the programme.
- The initial screening of DC sessions will take into consideration whether a DC has submitted their annual report (minimum requirement) and has regularly participated in the DC Coordination Group calls. The MAG will make a final selection of DC sessions based on the quality of proposals and depending on the space allocation in the overall programme.
- For those DCs that only need a room outside of the IGF programme (e.g., for annual DC meetings), the IGF Secretariat will make sure that the host country provides technical equipment to allow for hybrid meetings. Upon request, the IGF Secretariat could try to arrange for captioning.
- It was noted that the creation of DCs may lower the number of individual session submissions at the IGF, as DCs synthesized and consolidates proposals from various partners into one.
- It was suggested to ask DCs who intend to submit a DC session proposal (incl. a presentation of new reports/publications) to provide a list of projected outcomes for 2024 and present it to the MAG once the session evaluation has started. Later in the year, DCs could be asked again whether the outcomes will indeed be published on time. This would not apply to DCs that do not work on concrete outputs.
- It was also suggested providing a quiet space for people who may need to rest during the week of the IGF (e.g., with little noise, low visual stimuli...).
- DCs were reminded to also make individual efforts to integrate DCs' work in the IGF programme. Members could actively engage in [MAG working groups](#), in MAG main sessions preparations and more.
- Members were in favor of organizing a DC/intersessional event at the Open Consultations Day on 26 June. The MAG will be asked for approval.

Next steps

- **The IGF Secretariat will collect projected output proposals from Dynamic Coalitions for 2024.**
- **The IGF Secretariat will suggest in the draft schedule of the Second Open Consultations Day to include space for a DC/intersessional event.**
- **Dynamic Coalitions who require a room at the IGF 2024 for their annual meeting, that does not require a session slot on the programme should reach out to the IGF Secretariat.**
- **Dynamic Coalitions are encouraged to submit joint DC session proposals with other DCs.**

V. Introduction of the new DC on Measuring Digital Inclusion

Key points raised:

- The coordinator of the newly created [DC on Measuring Digital Inclusion](#) (DC-Digital Inclusion) introduced their partners (i.e. and UN University) and objectives. The DC will work on applying good evidence-based approaches and digital measurement frameworks for advancing inclusive digital governance and transformation towards gender-inclusive digital ecosystems.
- The DC will be active and outcome-oriented and welcomes synergies with other Dynamic Coalitions that are dealing with digital inclusion (DCAD, DC-Gender, DC-Children).

- With a growing number of Dynamic Coalitions working on Digital Inclusion, it was suggested that this topic could be the DC main session theme at the IGF 2024.

VI. Any other business

Key points raised:

- The IGF Secretariat shared the link to the [GDC zero draft](#), published on 1 April on the webpage of the Office of the UN Secretary-General's Envoy on Technology.
