- Key Issues raised (1 sentence per issue)

- The internet has changed, but Governance model does not adequately reflect that diversity
- When teaching about IG, use case studies that are relevant for the students.

- If reports and studies can't be translated in full, the abstracts should be translated into relevant languages.
- Invest in the young people; Encourage youth participation.
- Content needs to be in simple terms that are easy to understand.
- Find fun and innovative ways to reach newcomers: cartoons for example.
- Create content about issues of relevance to the community
- Diversity goes at a different speed than the Internet
- With over 2000 languages in Africa, the great numbers of languages is a challenge for local content.
- Development of localized content should itself be localized.
- Use of video and audio in order to send content in different scripts and languages can help aid communication
- IT capacity development is very important.

In looking at diversity in Internet governance through the lenses of content, the common theme was that content should be relevant and accessible. However, participants were quick to note that relevance and accessibility are different for everyone and require different approaches. With language, age, gender, geography, and much more to take into account, there were several suggestions about how our community can lower these barriers.

The panelists and audience had many suggestions which can be summarized into four buckets: localizing the process of content development, developing capacity through relevant content, building a sense of community and improving channels of communication. It was also suggested that we may have an issue about making Internet governance more accessible and engaging in general.

The discussion mentioned that diversity moves at a different speed than the Internet and incorporating diversity into the processes requires involvement at all levels. The needs of different communities will always be different and determining how to meet them should be driven by these communities. However, it is also important that the community at-large supports these needs.

- Create an office for diversity and inclusion within ICANN. This proposition aims to put in the debate the necessity to integrate the diversity policy in a global strategy. This office could be a good example for the IGF to identify ways to promote diversity.
- Set up national strategy to empower people to interact in Internet Governance
