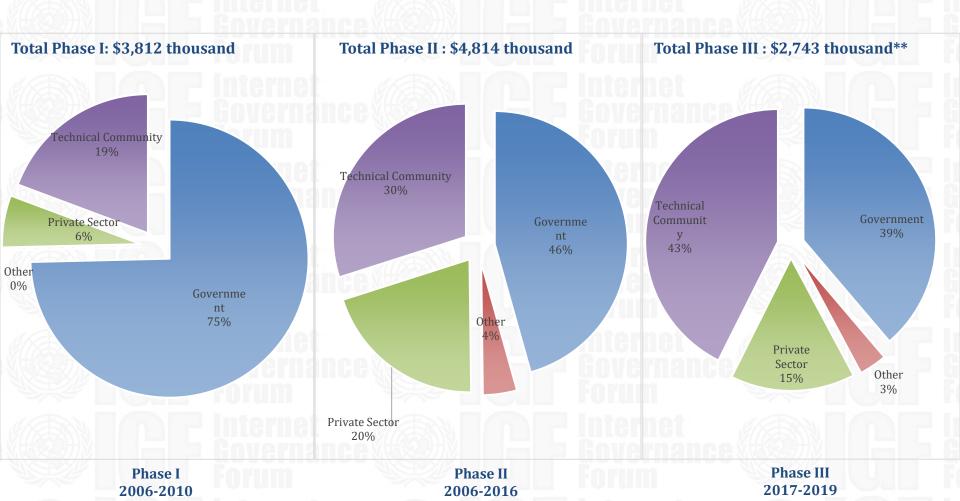


## The IGF Project

- ➤ The Secretariat of the Internet Governance Forum was established to support the United Nations Secretary-General in carrying out the mandate given by the World Summit on the Information Society with regard to convening a new forum for multi-stakeholder policy dialogue the Internet Governance Forum (IGF).
- ➤ The IGF Secretariat is an <u>extra-budgetary project</u> administered by the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs. <u>It is solely voluntary</u> <u>funded on a multi-donor (multi-stakeholder) basis</u>
- Voluntary funding secured for the IGF Secretariat is used to support:
  - Work of the IGF Secretariat, including staffing and operational costs
  - Capacity building activities, such as fellowship programmes, support to NRIs
  - Intersessional activities in preparation of the annual meeting of the IGF, best practice forums and policy initiatives
  - Travel support to the MAG Members from developing countries
- ➤ After conclusion of Phases I and II (2006-2010 and 2011-2016, respectively), the IGF Project is currently in Phase III, mandated for the period 2017-2025

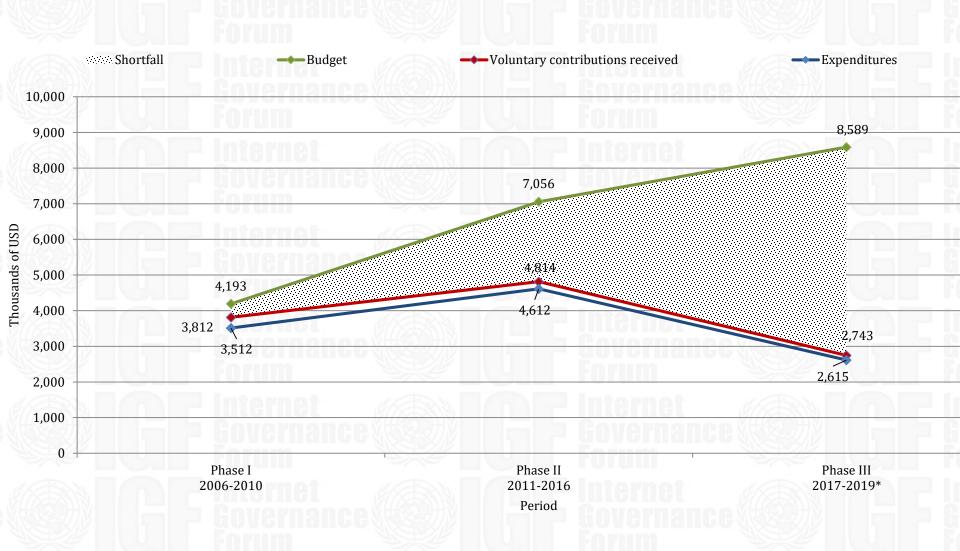
# Phases I-III – Recap: Overview of Contributions by Stakeholder Group and by IGF Phase\*

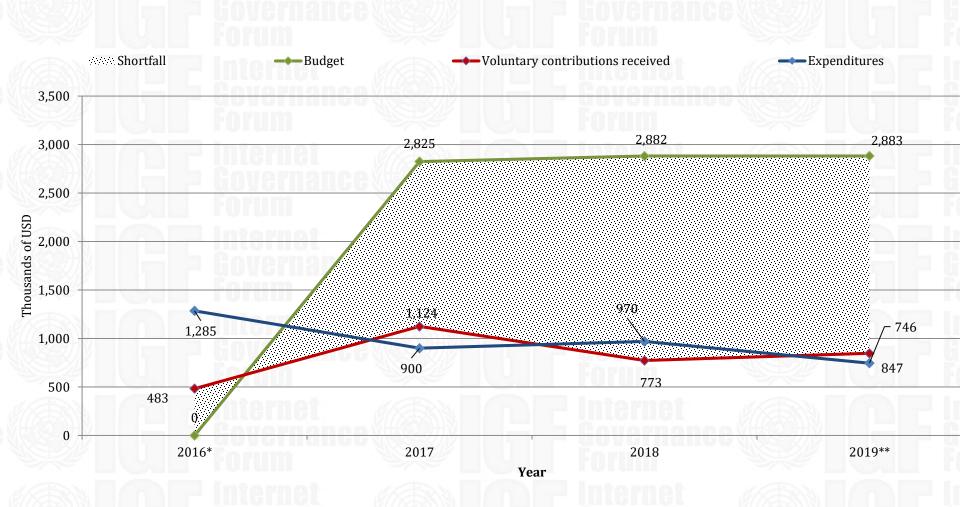

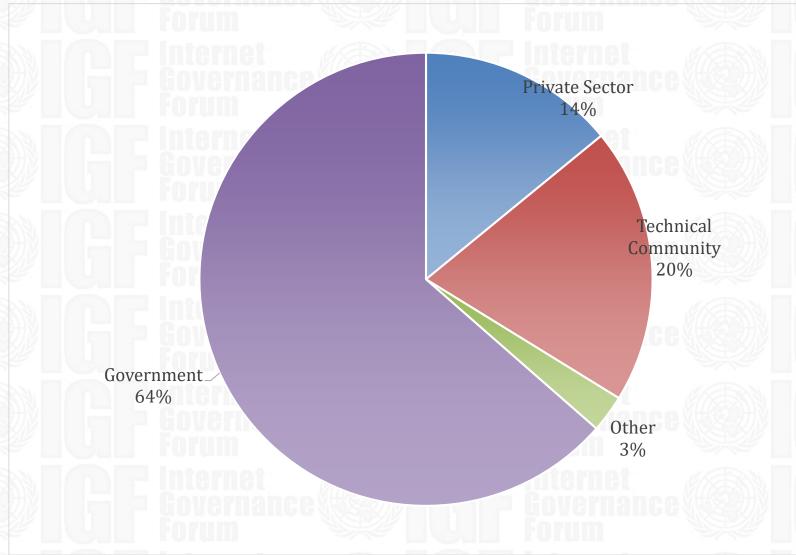

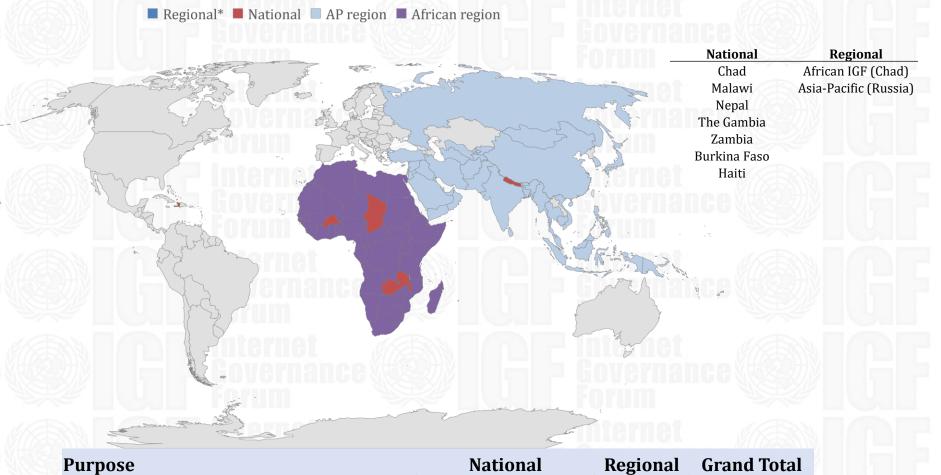

## 2020 and beyond

- ➤ The IGF Secretariat budget for the remainder of Phase III (2020-2025) amounts to \$2.9 million per year, or \$17.3 million in total
- ➤ To date, only two donors (the Netherlands and the EU) have made multi-year pledges, in the amount of approx. \$200 thousand pertaining for 2020, and \$110 thousand for 2021
- ➤ With the current level of expenditures and the received/confirmed contributions for 2019, it is expected that the remaining funds at the end of the year (excluding pledges mentioned above) will amount to approx. \$500 thousand
- ➤ Therefore, voluntary contributions from all stakeholders are welcome and are crucial to enable the IGF Secretariat to continue delivering its important mandate

### Making a contribution towards the IGF Secretariat

- Contact the IGF Secretariat informing of your Organization's intention to contribute to the IGF – please send an email to igf@un.org
- ➤ In coordination with UN DESA, the IGF Secretariat will advise on a suitable modality (exchange of letters or a contribution agreement) of formalizing the contribution
- Once the contribution is formalized, the contribution can be transferred to the bank account specified in the exchange of letters/agreement
- ➤ The IGF Secretariat will advise the donor once the funds have been received

### **In-kind contributions**

- Allowed under the United Nations Financial Regulations and Rules
- ➤ Can be accepted provided that the purposes for which the contributions are made are consistent with the policies, aims and activities of the United Nations.
- Decision on acceptance of such contributions shall be made on a case-by case basis, following the review of each offer
