

**Internet Governance Forum (IGF)
Dynamic Coalition Coordination Group
Virtual Meeting 47**

16 October 2020 at 13:00 UTC

Summary Report

Open Action Items:

- DCs to review the content of their information page on the IGF website for accuracy and to contact Ms. Dickinson with any updates that need to be made.
- Ms. Croll and Mr. Kummer to contact Tatiana Tropina and Timea Suto and ask if they are available to co-moderate the DC main session.
- All DC representatives to contribute to finalising the draft outline of the DC main session in time to enable Ms. Croll to present the details at the MAG meeting of 20 October (starting at 20:00 UTC).
- Marianne Franklin to send a list of past and current research and academic analyses of the work of DCs to the DC mailing list.

1. The forty-seventh virtual meeting of the Dynamic Coalition Coordination Group (DCCG) took place on 16 October 2020 at 13:00 UTC.

- Ms. Jutta Croll and Mr. Markus Kummer co-facilitated the meeting.
- Ms. Samantha Dickinson represented the IGF Secretariat.

2. Mr. Kummer welcomed participants to the call and requested participants to identify which Dynamic Coalition they are associated with for the record. Ms. Dickinson reminded participants that the live transcript provided by the captioners would be injected into the Zoom room and would be available via the “closed caption” link in the Zoom interface. She also requested that participants state their name each time they spoke during the call, so the transcript accurately reflected speakers.
3. Ms. Croll reminded participants of the status of work to finalise the DC main session at IGF 2020. The work from the previous DC Coordination meeting on the main session was made available via a [Google Doc](#). Ms. Croll reminded participants that on the previous call, there had been consensus to extend the call for substantive paper to just before the current meeting, for any DC wishing to be added to the list of main session

speakers. She observed that it probably wouldn't be possible to finalise speakers for the session in the current call, but that she needed to report back to the MAG meeting of 20 October on the DC main session, and hoped that the DCs would not lose their main session slot due to not enough preparation for the session.

- Michael Oghia apologised that the DC-Sustainability had not yet submitted its substantive paper, but would do so ASAP.
- Olivier Crepin-Leblond asked if the set of sub-themes listed in the Google Doc was set, or whether others could be added. Ms. Croll said that it wasn't yet closed, but there was a consideration about how many sub-themes could be addressed within the timeframe of the main session.
- Ms. Croll reminded participants that she was not the organiser of the session, and that it was the responsibility of the DCs to work together to develop the session. It was not Ms. Croll's decision who is to speak in the session and on what topic, but rather to facilitate DCs coordinate those decisions themselves.
- June Parris reported that the DC-SIDS hoped to submit a substantive paper by Monday.
- Mr. Kummer reminded participants that the aim of the DC main session was to discuss issues of joint interest to all DCs, rather than highlight the activities of any particular DC.
- Meri Baghdasaryan suggesting dividing the main session into four short panels based on the main themes listed in the Google draft, with each short panel addressing sub-themes within those main themes:
 - Digital divide
 - Fundamental rights
 - Education
 - The future of IGF
- There was discussion about potential moderators for the session. Ms Croll and Mr. Kummer agreed to reach out to two proposed moderators, Tatiana Tropina and Timea Suto.

ACTION ITEM: Ms. Croll and Mr. Kummer to contact Tatiana Tropina and Timea Suto and ask if they are available to co-moderate the DC main session.

ACTION ITEM: All DC representatives to contribute to finalising the draft outline of the DC main session in time to enable Ms. Croll to present the details at the MAG meeting of 20 October (starting at 20:00 UTC).

4. Mr. Kummer noted that as part of the DC Coordination, there had been agreement to have some common principles regarding how to run a DC, which included running a public mailing that was open for all to join and with publicly available archives. He reported that there was currently a case where one DC was having technical problems with its mailing list and asked if DCs believed that in such cases, it would be appropriate for the IGF Secretariat to create a mailing list within its own mailing list system. Ms. Croll noted that it would also be useful if the IGF Secretariat could host such mailing lists in cases where a DC chair who had used their employer's technical support to host a mailing list, then changed employers. DC representatives agreed this was a good way forward.

5. Mr. Kummer reminded participants of the proposed DC inclusion study that he had talked about on the previous call. Since that call, he had sent a [draft proposal in writing](#) to the DC Coordination mailing list. The proposal is to develop a comprehensive guide to DC operations, including processes for approving new DCs, dealing with any DC-related disputes, and help make the argument for greater secretariat support for the DCs. A [Google Doc is now available](#) for DC members to add any ideas they may have on what should be included in the study.

- Marianne Franklin suggested including references to existing research and academic analyses of the work of DCs and said she'd send a list through of these to the DC mailing list.

ACTION ITEM: Marianne Franklin to send a list of past and current research and academic analyses of the work of DCs to the DC mailing list.

6. Participants agreed to hold a DC Coordination Meeting 13:00-14:00 UTC, **23 October**, to complete any remaining elements of the DC main session that hadn't been finalised before the MAG meeting of October 20.
