

INTERNET GOVERNANCE FORUM NATIONAL, (SUB)REGIONAL AND YOUTH IGF INITIATIVES - Virtual Meeting X | 20 November 2023 at 14:00 UTC -

SUMMARY REPORT

Action Items:

- IGF Secretariat to consolidate all action points into objectives for NRIs consideration for 2024 workplan. The workplan is to be subject to public consultations for approximately one month.
- 1. The tenth virtual meeting of the National, Sub-regional, Regional and Youth IGF Initiatives (NRIs) of the IGF 2023 preparatory cycle, took place on 20 November 2023 at 14:00 UTC.
- 2. The meeting was hosted by the IGF Secretariat's NRIs Focal Point. The final, adopted version of the Agenda is attached to this document as Annex A1 and a list of meeting participants as Annex A2.
- 3. The Host opened the meeting by reminding that its objective is to share feedback on the NRIs work in 2023 and suggest ideas for 2024 work.
- 4. The discussion resulted in several action points summarised below:

Summary of points

- 5. Overall, participants shared positive feedback on the 2023 work emphasizing the good quality of the 18th annual IGF meeting, its high participation and rich discussions.
- 6. Some voiced concerns about the timeline for the NRIs grants the Secretariat publishes every year in March, suggesting potential solutions such as flexible deadlines to enable the NRIs that host meetings in the first quarter of the year to apply.
- 7. All the shared ideas for the 2024 work are consolidated below, subject to public consultations among all NRIs for four weeks:
